Starting from the Carpark (Buckley Avenue opposite Catalina Cafe):

- 1. Exit left < from the car park, and follow the path straight ahead along Buckley Avenue.
- 2. Turn right > into Marine Parade
- 3. Turn left < into Marlborough Crescent (married officers housing)
- 4. Turn left < into Hudson Bay Road
- 5. Turn left < down steps to head for the ferry terminal
- 6. Continue along the water's edge to the right >
- 7. Join Boundary Road and continue straight ahead
- 8. At the end of Boundary Road, turn right > into Wallace Road
- 9. Turn left < into Onekiritea Road
- 10. Turn left < at the end, then right > behind the bus shelter, onto track to the children's playground
- 11. Cross Buckley Avenue into the wetlands opposite
- 12. Follow the path alongside the wetland area, then continue along gravel track around field to return to the carpark.

Please note; There is much change occurring in this area due to residential development therefore these instructions may not be up-to-date and accurate.


