Starting from Opanuku Reserve (Henderson Valley Road)

- I. From the carpark, follow the walking track to the left <.
- 2. At Henderson Park follow the concrete path that runs beside the toilet block
- 3. Turn left < along stream walking track
- 4. Turn right > over the bridge, then turn left < onto the walking track (keep following the signs to Border Road)
- 5. At Shona Place keep following the walking track
- 6. At end of track, turn left < onto Border Road
- 7. Turn left < just after the road bridge, onto cycle way and follow the concrete path
- 8. Turn left < at Keeling Road and rejoin the cycle path.
- 9. After the Carpark at Henderson Park, continue following the edge of the park towards the Corban Estate footbridge.
- 10. Follow the path around to the right > of the buildings.
- 11. Turn right > into great North Road.
- 12. Turn right > into Henderson Valley Road to return to Opanuku Reserve.
