## Start from Devonport Ferry Terminal.

- I. Turn left < along Queens Parade.
- 2. Turn right > into Garden Terrace. Continue along walkway.
- 3. Turn left < into Clarence Street.
- 4. Cross Callope Road into Shoal Bay Road.
- 5. At end at Melrose Reserve turn right > then left < into Jim Titchener Parade.
- 6. Once past Mozeley Avenue, turn right > to cross a small pedestrian bridge and continue along walkway.
- 7. Enter Abbortsford Terrace.
- 8. Turn left < into Victoria Road.
- 9. Enter Ngataringa Park via the boardwalk and continue straight ahead.
- 10. At the corner of the park where it meets Lake Road, turn right > onto shared pathway back across the Park towards the skateboard park.
- 11. Continue straight ahead to the far corner and enter Victoria Road.
- 12. Continue down Victoria Road to return the ferry terminal.

## **Devonport Ngataringa Loop**

**Description:** A mix of level paths, steep paths and steps. Suitable for most ages and levels of fitness and mobility, designed with flat shoes or running shoes in mind. Not suitable for wheelchairs and pushchairs.

**To see**: Wonderful Hauraki Gulf and Auckland City views, historical buildings, Victorian style homes.

**Time**: approx. 60 minutes (about 5.5 kms). **Parking:** In Devonport Village near ferry terminal or along King Edward Parade.

**Ferry:** From Downtown Ferry Building (Hint: catch a train to Britomart for added adventure).


**Mount Victoria** is higher than North Head and closer to Auckland City – thus provides magnificent views.
