## Start: Takapuna Boat Ramp, The Promenade

- I. Head south along Takapuna Beach.
- 2. Turn right > into Clifton Road (just before the cliffs) and follow the Clifton Road to the left <
- 3. Cross Lake Road to enter Northumberland Avenue
- 4. Turn right > onto the walkway between houses 35 and 37 and enter Northboro Road.
- 5. Cross Northboro Road, then turn left < into Northboro Reserve
- 6. Follow the track then turn right > onto the boardwalk.
- 7. Exit into Francis Street. Continue along Francis Street, past Jutland Road, Norman Road and Crichton Terrace.
- 8. Turn right > into Hart Road and walk downhill to the bottom.
- 9. Turn left < into the shared walkway/cycleway between houses 35 and 33 and exit into Harley Close.
- 10. Keep to the left and turn left < into Eldon Street.
- 11. Turn left < into Esmonde Road.
- 12. At the next pedestrian lights cross over Esmonde Road and turn left < and continue over the bridge.
- 13. Turn right > into Barry's Point Road. Just before the shops, turn right > into the small parking area and turn into the Patuone Walkway which wanders alongside the inlet.
- 14. Continue across the bridge and up to exit by the Girl Guide Centre. Turn right > into Como Street.
- 15. Turn left < into Auburn Street. Cross over Anzac Street at the lights and continue down Auburn Street.
- 16. Turn right > into Killarney Street.
- 17. Turn right > into The Promenade and walk past the Bruce Mason Theatre, across Hurstmere Road and back to the start.



## Takapuna Explorer


