

Start from the Takapuna Boat ramp.

1. At the shore line, turn left < (north) along the pathway. Continue following the pathway along the shoreline to Milford Reserve.
2. Continue across the Reserve to walk alongside the Milford boat marina in Wairau Creek.
3. Exit the reserve past the club houses, and turn right > into Craig Road.
4. Turn right > into Omana Road.
5. Turn left < into Ihumata Road.
6. Cross over Milford Road and continue straight ahead into Frater Avenue.
7. Turn right > into Saltburn Road.
8. Turn left < into Kitchener Road, continue along Hurstmere Road.
9. Turn left < into Earnoch Avenue
10. Turn right > into Alison Avenue
11. Turn left < into The Promenade and return to the start.

Takapuna Milford Loop

Description: Partly rocky and narrow seaside pathway. Slippery when wet. Avoid at high tide and stormy weather. Suitable for users of average fitness and mobility.

To see: Hauraki Gulf, beaches, marina, residential homes.

Time: approx. 75 minutes. (about 6.22 kms)

Parking: Takapuna Boat Ramp, The Promenade


