## Start from the Takapuna Boat ramp.

- I. At the shore line, turn left < (north) along the pathway. Continue following the pathway along the shoreline to Milford Reserve.
- 2. Continue across the Reserve to walk alongside the Milford boat marina in Wairau Creek.
- 3. Exit the reserve past the club houses, and turn right > into Craig Road.
- 4. Turn right > into Omana Road.
- 5. Turn left < into Ihumata Road.
- 6. Cross over Milford Road and continue straight ahead into Frater Avenue.
- 7. Turn right > into Saltburn Road.
- 8. Turn left < into Kitchener Road, continue along Hurstmere Road.
- 9. Turn left < into Earnoch Avenue
- 10. Turn right > into Alison Avenue
- 11. Turn left < into The Promenade and return to the start.


