Starting from the Carpark (entrance Manukau Road between Lewin Road and Haydn Avenue):

- I. Take the footpath to the left < of the playground keeping the observatory on your right > as you head up the hill.
- 2. Keep left < past the Sorrento Conference Centre (do not turn right).
- 3. Follow the road on the right > to the summit (may be omitted if too steep).
- 4. Follow the road back down the hill and turn right > to continue around the hill (passing alongside the Olive Grove).
- 5. Proceed past Acacia Cottage on the left < and the Information Centre and restaurant on the right >.Visitors may wish to visit the Information Centre.
- 6. Continue down the hill keeping to the path between the trees.
- 7. At the picnic area and carpark turn right >.
- 8. Cross over the road at the round-a-bout and continue right > down Twin Oak Drive. (Watch out for families of pheasants feeding under the oak trees.)
- 9. *** Optional Excursion see below.
- 10. Follow the road along the path until you reach the Sorrento Conference Centre.
- II.Turn left < and follow either the road or the path down the hill and back to the Carpark and children's playground.

** Optional Excursion:

- 9. At the next right-hand bend cross over the road, and follow the road (Grand Drive) to the right > that has a picnic area beside it.
- 10. Follow the road until you reach a small wooden gate, on the right > in front of a stand of trees.
- II. Enter the area and note the ferns and volcanic rocks (and if you are very quiet children might see some magic fairies!).
- 12. Walk through and out the other side exit from the gate in the corner (opposite the archery club and toilets).
- 13. Follow the road along the path to the left < until you reach the Sorrento Conference Centre.
- 14. Turn left < and follow either the road or the path down the hill and back to the Carpark and children's playground.

Cornwall Park

Description: A mix of mainly level paths, and a few steep paths. Suitable for users of all ages and abilities, suitable for normal footwear and for wheelchairs and pushchairs.

To see: City views, harbour views, trees, Volcano, farm animals, observatory. The Park is home to many birds ranging from Native Pigeon, Fantail to California Quail, White-faced Heron and Paradise Shelduck.

Time: approx. 60 minutes.

Parking: Carpark, Manukau Road entrance. **Buses**: to Manukau Road, One Tree Hill (654 Manukau Rd Stop 8726)

Cafés: I) Frolic Café, Manukau Road opposite the park entrance. I have had many coffees here – children friendly. 2) Cornwall Park restaurant and ice-cream kiosk 3) Various at Greenwoods Corner (Golf Road exit).

Public toilets: Manukau Road Carpark, beside the Cornwall Park Restaurant and near the Archery Club.

Children's playgrounds: Beside the Manukau Road entrance. Lots of paths for children to ride bicycles near the band rotunda.



Dogs: On leash area only

Picnic and <u>Barbecue</u> (contained within Cornwall Park) facilities available.

Other Facilities: flying fox, pergola, tables, drinking fountains, bike stands, toilets, skate park

Other nearby Attractions:

<u>Auckland Observatory</u>, Royal Oak Mall, Greenwoods Corner Village (off Manukau Rd)
