

## Enter the Dover Myer Robinson Park thru the stone archway at the corner of Gladstone Road and Judges Bay Road

1. Turn right > through the archway of the Nancy Steen Gardens.
2. Turn left < onto the boardwalk and follow the path down the hill to Judges Bay.
3. Turn right > into Judges Bay Road, then left < alongside the houses into Martyn Fields Reserve.
4. Follow the windy path up the hill towards St Stephens chapel and graveyard.
5. Follow the path straight ahead thru the lych gate and continue up Judge Street.
6. Turn left < at the end of Judge Street into Saint Stephens Avenue.
7. Turn left < around the park at the end to get views of the city skyline.
8. At the end of the loop, go down the steps beside the Parnell Baths.
9. Continue straight ahead over the bridge that goes over the railway tracks and the road.
10. At the far end of the bridge, go down the steps.
11. Turn right > at the bottom of the steps (look out for cyclists).
12. Turn right > into Solent Street – walk to the end (no exit) and back.
13. Cross Tamaki Drive at the lights, and turn right > towards the city.
14. Turn left < into The Strand.
15. Cross Saint Georges Bay Road and turn left < into Augustus Terrace Walkway.
16. Turn left < into Fox Street.
17. Turn left < into York Street.
18. Turn right > into Bradford Street.
19. Turn left < into Garfield Street.
20. Turn right > into Saint Georges Bay Road.
21. Turn left < into the La Cigale carpark. Follow the roadway around to the right > in front of the buildings and around the corner.
22. Enter Alberon Reserve. Turn left < onto the walkway, turn right > up the second set of steps, turn left < and follow the boardwalk around to exit into Staffa Street.
23. Turn right > into Stratford Street.
24. Turn left < into Gladstone Road and continue straight ahead to the stone arch entranceway.

## Parnell Roses, Cranes & Trains

**Description:** A mix of level paths and steep paths/steps. Caution: Muddy and slippery when wet. Suitable for most ages and levels of fitness and mobility, designed with flat shoes or running shoes in mind. Not suitable for wheelchairs and pushchairs.

**To see:** NZ native ferns palms and cycads, roses, Waitemata Harbour views, City views, helicopters, cranes, big trucks, container wharf, Parnell Baths

**Time:** approx. 60 minutes. (about 5kms)

**Parking:** Gladstone Road or Stanwell Street, off Gladstone Road, Parnell

**Buses:** to 85 Gladstone Road (opposite Stanwell Street, Parnell)

**JUDGE'S BAY** In 1841 Judge Martin and Attorney General Swainson arrived in Auckland with houses in prefabricated sections. Swainson built on the west side and the Martins on the east of this bay. Known as Taurarau 'the two ropes' it is thought that this name referred to the two administrators of British justice. The little chapel of St. Stephen's built in 1857 by Frederick Thatcher is all that remains of this time. The Constitution of the Anglican Church was signed here in 1857.

**Dove Myer Robinson Park** Named after the popular and longest serving Mayor of Auckland, Dove Myer Robinson Park overlooks the beautiful Waitemata Harbour.
