

Starting from Britomart or Aotea Square:

1. Turn left < into Britomart Place, right > into Customs Street East, then left < into Queen Street.
2. Continue up Queen Street to Aotea Square.
3. Enter Aotea Square and head left < to walk alongside the Town Hall (on your left <)
4. Turn left < into the carpark (Neales Lane) and go under the Mayoral Drive road bridge
5. Enter Myers Park and continue straight ahead, up the steps to exit from Myers Park
6. Continue up steps to Kevins Arcade, exit to the right > into Karangahape Road
7. Continue along Karangahape Road, then turn right > into Ponsonby Road
8. Turn right > down the footpath where the murals are, then take the centre path
9. Turn left < at next junction
10. Then the next left <, continue up the slight rise
11. Next left <, followed by a right > at the T-junction and continue straight ahead
12. At the entrance, turn hard right > and walk past the children's playground
13. Keep to the left < going up the hill
14. Take next left < toward the boardwalk and steps
15. At the top of the steps turn left < into Hopetoun Street
16. Keep to the footpath on the right > to go over the bridge (Auckland Girls Grammar on your left)
17. Cross Pitt Street and continue straight ahead down Vincent Street
18. At the next traffic lights, cross Vincent Street to your right >, then cross Mayoral Drive
19. Continue straight ahead down Mayoral Drive towards ASB Theatre
20. Turn right > down the steps to the Herald Theatre and continue alongside the ASB Theatre Building to return to Aotea Square.
21. Turn left < down Queen Street to return to Britomart.

To see: Views of Mount Eden, Auckland City, Auckland Harbour bridge, parks, K'Rd shops

Time: Loop approx. 60 minutes. (about 4 kms)

Parking: 1 hour meter parking off Queen Street (2 hours on Sundays)

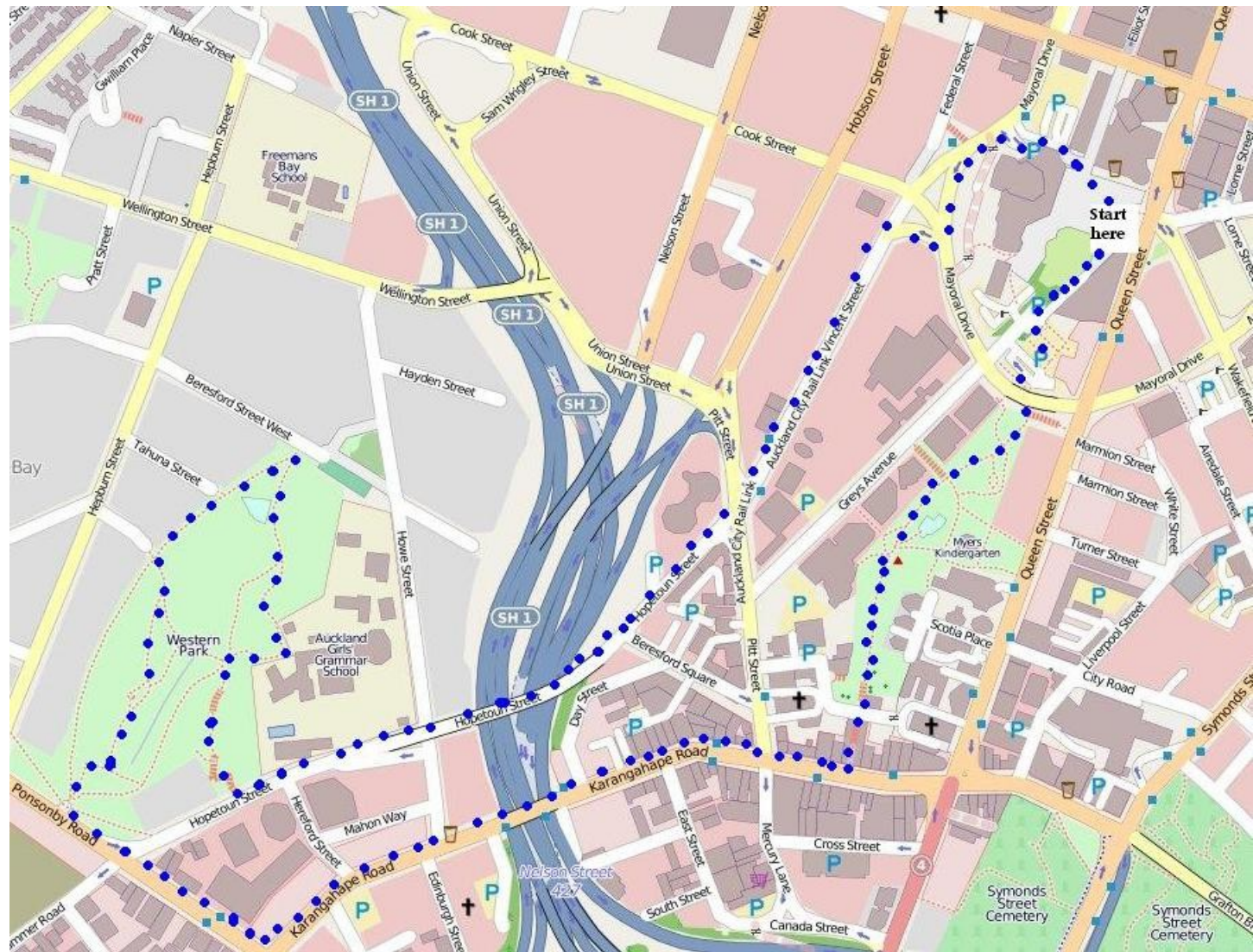
