

### Starting from Britomart, Queens Street exit:

1. Cross over Customs Street to walk up Queen Street on the right hand side.
2. Turn right > into Victoria Street West
3. Turn left < into Elliot Street
4. Turn left < into Victoria Arcade
5. Turn left < into Queen Street
6. Cross Queen Street at the pedestrian lights on the corner of Aotea Square to enter Rutland Street
7. Turn left < into Mayoral Drive
8. Cross over Wellesley Street East to Kitchener Street and the Auckland Art Gallery
9. Turn right > up the steps beside the Art Gallery
10. Make your way to the Albert Park fountain
11. Continue round to the other side of the fountain, exit Albert Park into Princes Street
12. Turn left > along Princes Street and then cross Princes Street at the pedestrian crossing.
13. Continue left < along Princes Street
14. Turn right > along pathway to Old Government House (just past the Clock Tower)
15. Follow the pathway alongside Old Government House to exit at Waterloo Quadrant (opposite Auckland High Court). Cross Waterloo Quadrant at the lights.
16. Turn left < along Waterloo Quadrant
17. Turn right > into Princes Street
18. At the end, cross over Eden Crescent and continue straight ahead down steps into Emily Place
19. Turn left < out of Emily Place to enter Shortland Street straight ahead
20. Turn left < into Fields Lane
21. Cross Chancery Street and enter Chancery Lane (off Bacon Lane)
22. Keep going straight ahead to exit into Chancery Street (thru Freyberg Place)
23. Turn right > into High Street
24. Turn left < into Fort Street
25. Turn right > into Queen Street
26. Turn right > Queens Arcade
27. At the end of the arcade, turn right > into Customs Street
28. Cross Customs Street to turn left < into Commerce Street
29. Turn left < into Tyler Street and return to Britomart

Auckland City is a busy port city (established in the 1840's) It is still young compared to other world cities, with a population of just of 1.5 million (2012). There is a mix of old and new architecture. Developments such as the Wynyard Quarter are replacing the previous port industrial area. The size of the CBD is 433 ha, similar to the Sydney CBD, and it sits partly on land reclaimed from the Waitemata Harbour.
