

Starting from Lynn Mall Carpark, Great North Road:

1. Cross Great North Road at the corner of Veronica Street
2. Continue straight ahead into Veronica Street
3. Turn right > Delta Avenue
4. Turn left < into Binstead Road
5. Turn right > into Rata Street
6. Veer right > into side street and then turn right > onto the footpath heading towards the power pylon
7. Come back out onto Rata Street, cross the road bridge over the Whau River and on the other side follow footpath to the right > that goes under the bridge.
8. Follow the footpath straight ahead to the boardwalk
9. At the top of the rise, turn left < and follow the path along the river
10. At the end, turn right > into Riversdale Road and then right > into Tony Segedin Drive
11. Continue along the footpath until you reach #43, turn right > down the path into the reserve
12. Turn right > at the T-junction to follow the path (left fork) back over the boardwalk
13. Turn left < into Ash Street (at the pump station) and then right > to come out on Rata Street, turn right > and cross the road bridge
14. Turn right > at the first entrance into Ken Maunder Park
15. Turn right > and head to the footpath, then turn left < onto the footpath.
16. Follow the footpath around the edge of Ken Maunder Park
17. At the changing rooms/public toilets, turn right > into Binstead Road
18. Cross Rata Street and continue down Binstead Road
19. Turn right > into Delta Avenue
20. Turn left < into Veronica Street
21. Cross Great North Road to return to the carpark

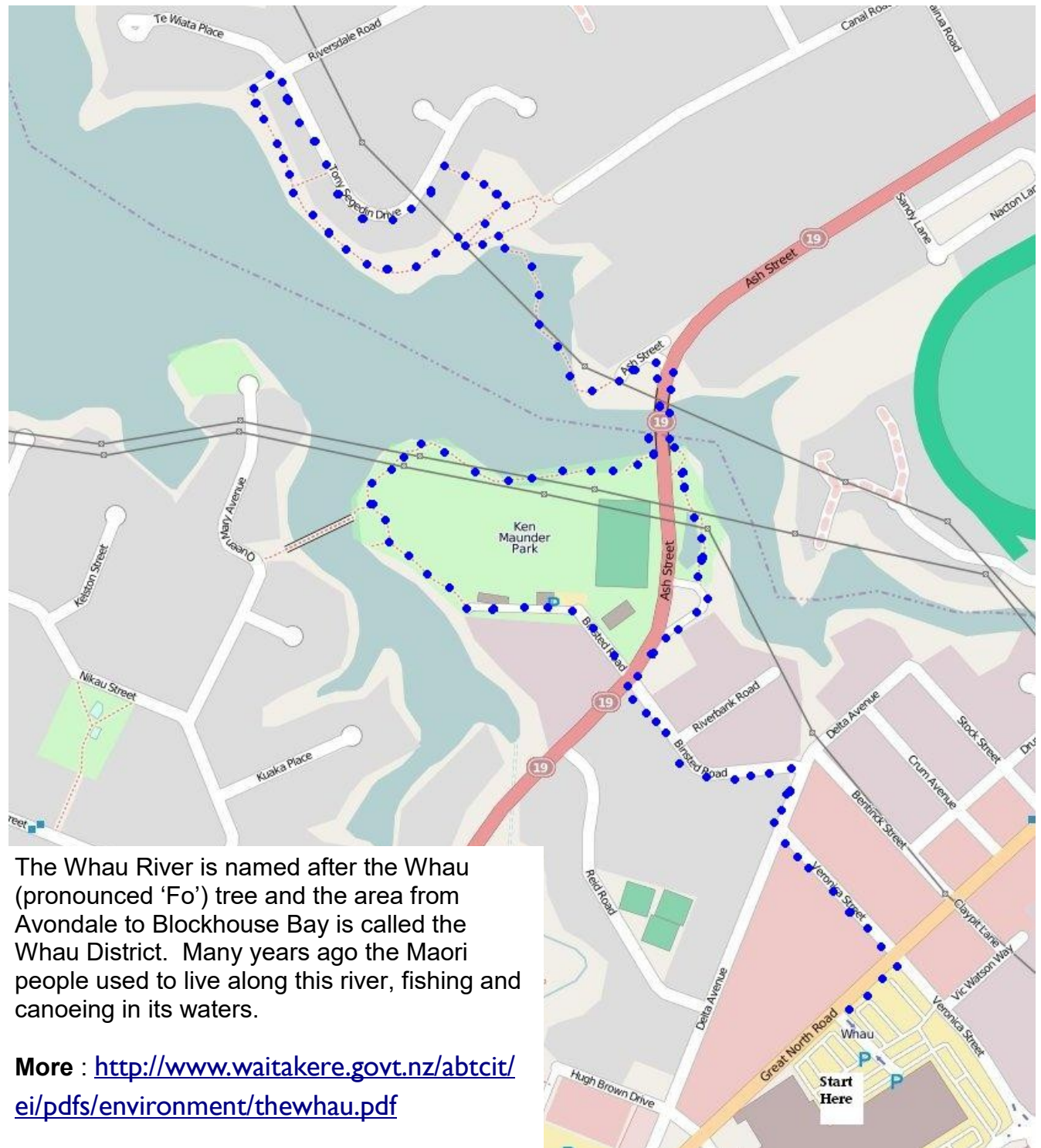
